Keeping your pets safe in the heat

- Do not leave your pet in a parked car.
 A parked car quickly becomes
 dangerously hot, even with the
 windows left partly opened.
- Be aware of the humidity. When
 the humidity is high, dogs have a
 harder time cooling themselves.
 A dog's temperature should not
 be over 104 degrees. To cool a dog
 down, offer an ice pack or wet towel
 for them to lay on. Add ice cubes to
 their water dish.
- Limit outdoor activities and exercise on hot days. Adjust the duration and type of activity you do with your dog on hot days.
 Extended periods of time in the heat can lead to heat stroke and death.
 Always carry water to help keep your pet hydrated.

- Provide shade and water. When you're outside, be sure your pet has protection from heat and sun. Add ice to water when possible to keep it cold. Find shade under trees where airflow is constant.
- Know the signs of heat stroke.

 Symptoms include: difficulty
 breathing or sudden rapid breath, a
 blank or anxious stare, off-color gums
 and tongue, disorientation, excessive
 drooling, lack of urine, muscle
 tremors, or sudden collapse.
- Call your veterinarian. If your animal is showing any concerning signs of being dehydrated like loss of appetite, reduced energy levels, excessive panting, sunken, dry-looking eyes, dry nose and gums, palen gums, or loss of skin elasticity, call your veterinarian immediately.

Outdoor events are great ways to spend time with family, friends, and with a little extra planning, your canine companion too!

First, make sure that the event is in a dog-friendly location and follow all the posted rules. Make sure that other people attending the event are okay with you bringing your dog.

What to bring:

- Poop bags
- Leash
- Food and water bowls
- Dog bed or a towel/blanket
- Long line or tie out
- Chew toys or enrichment toys
- Dog treats
- Tennis ball, frisbee, or other retrieving toys

Once you arrive to the event, choose a place to set up your dog's things before doing anything else.

Have your dog on a leash when introducing him to other guests.

When people begin to eat, take your dog back to his area and give him a stuffed Kong or other enrichment toy to keep him busy.

You know your dog best. If your dog gets overstimulated, overwhelmed, or nervous in new environments, it is probably best to leave him back home where he will be more comfortable.

Always pick up after your dog.

Be on the lookout for picnic scraps such as chicken bones and other litter that could harm your dog.

Be prepared to leave early.

NEVER leave your dog in the car.





Fireworks, Thunderstorms, and Big Booms, Oh My!

How to Navigate Loud Noises That Scare Your Pet

Many dogs and cats experience anxiety when they hear sudden, loud noises. With the Fourth of July quickly approaching, more people will be gathering for holiday parties where fireworks may be set off at odd times and in unexpected locations.

What does a scared pet look like?


A scared pet will show many signs of discomfort. They may run and hide to a place they feel is safest, often in an interior room like a bedroom or bathroom. Other signs of a distressed dog may include tongue flicking, ears back, whale eyes, trembling, a tail that is down and tucked, or nervous yawning. They may be clingy, and want to cuddle closely with you, or they may show heavy panting, or drooling.

What can I do to help my pet?

First of all, take your dog outside before it gets dark to avoid fireworks. When your pet is stressed you should try and create a safe, calm environment for them. Reduce the noises they can hear by setting up a comfortable place for them in the quietest part of the home. Place a bed, their favorite toys and treats in the basement, or an interior room to help insulate them from the noises outside, and create a calm environment for them. Drowning out the sounds with more familiar, louder sounds, may also help. White noise, music, podcasts, or your favorite show, can all be helpful sounds to reduce noises that frighten your pet.

There are also products available that may help your dog. Mutt Muffs are earmuffs for dogs that can help drown out the loud sounds of fireworks or thunderstorms.

A Thundershirt compresses your dog strategically in the right places, so it's a little like a bear hug for your freaked out friend.

When to call a vet

Some dogs are so stressed out that talking to your veterinarian might help. Knowing that thunderstorms and fireworks often happen unpredictably, just means you should prepare for the next time your pal becomes anxious. Especially if your dog shows excessive panting or heavy drooling, call your veterinarian when the event has passed and schedule an appointment.

Give your pet all the comfort they need Soothe and calm your dog as much as it takes to make them feel safe and happy when they are scared by fireworks or thunderstorms.






